Teach your parent..

1. Math's – Multiplication and division

Teach your parent the multiplication and division facts up to 12×12

Use this activity to show your parent how confident you are with your times tables up to 12×12 . Explain how multiplication helps us work out groups quickly, and division helps us split numbers into equal parts. Try quizzing each other using facts you already know — for example, if $6 \times 4 = 24$, then you can teach them that $24 \div 6 = 4$. Have fun testing each other, spotting patterns, and seeing how many facts you can remember without looking.

2. English – Retelling *A Midsummer Night's Dream*

After watching, try retelling the story to your parent in your own words. Tell them what happened first, next, and at the end.

Use props or act out your favourite scene to make it fun!
You could use toys, costumes, or even draw simple pictures.

Talk about the characters together and explain what makes the play magical. Think about the costumes, the setting, the music, or any surprising moments.



3. History- Bronze Age and Iron Age

Using the BBC Bitesize link, talk to your parent about what life was like in the Bronze Age and Iron Age. In the Bronze Age, people began making tools and jewellery from bronze, and they travelled in wooden boats to trade metal and other goods.

Explain how things changed in the Iron Age, when people started using stronger iron tools, lived in hillforts, and worked together in tribes to farm and trade.

5. Computing – Scratch

Use the Scratch link on our webpage to show your parent how to make a sprite move across the screen. Explain that you can choose any character (called a sprite) and use simple motion blocks like “move 10 steps” to make it travel.

Show them how to pick a background from the Scratch library to set the scene, and then add sounds using the sound tab so your sprite can play music or make fun noises. Encourage them to try it with you—you'll be the teacher!

6. Science/ Design and technology – Healthy eating
